- Formed in 2010 as a result of the NFAHW Strategy (2009)
- 3 year mandate Mandate renewed 2013
- 14 Members from industry, federal, provincial and territorial governments
- Government representation includes animal and public health
- Funded by industry, federal and provincial gov't



Vision

"Canada values and supports the health, care and welfare of the farmed animal population and its contribution to the well-being of people, the environment and the Canadian economy."



2012-13 Highlights

- Council scheduled regularly on the Reg. ADM agenda
- Renewal of mandate by Reg. ADMs and other stakeholders
- Implementation of animal welfare and surveillance recommendations has begun
- Relationships around the table continue to grow

Strategy Renewal

- The NFAHW Strategy (2009) due for renewal
- Intent is:
 - To continue the path established in the original strategy
 - Ensure the strategy is owned by stakeholders
 - Process to demonstrate stakeholder contribution to Strategic Outcomes

Antimicrobial Use/Antimicrobial Resistance

- Working group established includes Council, Public Health and Health Canada (VDD)
- Progress has been interrupted by changes in representation
- New chair will be appointed



Emerging Issues

- Used Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea as a model to consider how Canada should respond to emerging and re-emerging issues.
- Report from the working group and the implementation later in the agenda



Animal Welfare Research Capacity Project

- A new project which comes as a result of recommendation 7 in the animal welfare advisory paper (2012)
- Led by AAFC and Council
- Initiated in November 2013
- Completion planned for April 2014.





Value of advice

- Recommendations advisory statements surveillance, animal welfare and emerging issues have provided opportunities for organizations to begin implementation.
- Some organizations will report later on how they have used the recommendations.
- Recommendations have broad value in providing a vision of longer term outcomes.



Reporting to FPT Reg. ADMs - workplan

- Improve animal health one health principles -Governance
 - Collaborative approach in AHW programs
 - Surveillance linked animal, human, wildlife and food safety – enhance anticipation
 - Animal welfare assurance system improved
 - Implementation of one health model
 - Renew NFAHW Strategy
- Antimicrobial Resistance
 - Implementation and linkage of surveillance systems monitoring use
